
SMALL BUSINESS COVERAGE

Our Small Business Reporter, Megan Jamerson, dedicates her work to celebrating small businesses and investigating the trends that impact our communities:

- A <u>co-operative ownership model</u> to keep local businesses in the neighborhoods they serve in LA
- The impacts of rising inflation costs for businesses
- An <u>exploration of small theater venues in the North</u>
 Hollywood Arts District still struggling post-pandemic

Through 'In the Weeds,' Evan Kleiman, host of *Good Food*, paints compelling portraits of Los Angeles' restaurant businesses — and the who, why, and how of selling, eating, and sharing our food.

Good Food also has weekly chats with chefs across LA who discuss their latest farmers market finds and share how they intentionally use each local ingredient to create the perfect dish.



HOUSING COVERAGE

KCRW's Housing and Homelessness Reporter Anna Scott explores the pressing issue of housing and homelessness in Los Angeles and its intersection with the veteran community.

Scott covered the 2022 civil rights lawsuit against the U.S.
Department of Veterans Affairs by homeless veterans in Los
Angeles and their advocates. The plaintiffs, 14 veterans who are all
unhoused and suffer from serious mental or physical disabilities,
accused the agency of misusing a huge VA campus in West LA and
breaking a promise to build 1,200 affordable apartments there.

During 2022's election season, KCRW and The LA Times hosted a debate between LA's mayoral candidates on the issue of homelessness. Live-streamed from KCRW headquarters, Scott and The LA Times columnist and host, Gustavo Arellano, moderated an in-depth discussion with Karen Bass, Kevin de Leon, and Gina Viola.

This event was part of a broader effort to support our community members in making informed election decisions.

CLIMATE COVERAGE

KCRW's Healthy Communities Reporter Caleigh Wells covers the environment, climate and public health. Much of her coverage has focused on California's historic wildfires and drought, as well as the COVID-19 pandemic. She recently reported on:

- An <u>investigation into the US Forest Service's fire mitigation</u>
 work with The California Newsroom
- A group of <u>teenagers on their quest to save the world</u> from the climate crisis
- Local water agency officials and <u>cemetery employees on</u> <u>how they're saving and recycling water</u> during this historic drought
- A <u>farmer who's using a fraction of the water to grow his</u> <u>tomatoes</u> in his hydroponic greenhouse
- People who have dedicated their time to <u>saving the</u> <u>remaining few hundred acres of a unique habitat on the</u> <u>peaks of the San Bernardino Mountains</u>
- The <u>environmentalists</u> who have spent years trying to save <u>Southern California's iconic Joshua Tree</u> from climate-induced extinction



EMERGING TALENT

As an innovator in public radio, KCRW is proud to use our platform to amplify emerging talent in our community. Through initiatives supported by members, we nurture new voices to bring you fresh perspectives.

Young Creators Project: We invited Los Angeles youth to share their work in music, poetry & storytelling, and visual arts. The top creators were featured across KCRW channels including <u>our website</u>, social media, and on-air.

10th Annual Radio Race: Contestants had 24-hours to create a non-fiction audio piece based on a shared theme. The winning pieces were aired on KCRW.

Global Beat: This music series highlights emerging artists from around the world. Our second season takes us to Mexico, with host KCRW DJ Raul Campos alongside our curators, Mexico City DJ and music supervisor Junf, festival director and music consultant Monica Saldaña, and NPR's Betto Arcos.

FUTURE PUBLIC RADIO TALENT

Our Report LA Fellowship program aims to recruit underrepresented voices to public radio. The Fellowship pays full-time salaries and provides extensive training in public radio producing and reporting. The first cohort of Fellows worked with KCRW for two years and finished in September 2021. We are proud to have placed one of our Fellows in a full-time position in our news department.

Now in its second cohort, thanks to our ongoing funders, the Report LA Fellowship continues to be an important investment in the future of KCRW and public media.

Our new event series, Open House, opens doors to celebrate community. We invited the Inglewood community to enjoy the The Kinsey African American Art & History Collection inside SoFi Stadium for a free and fun evening of music, art and good vibes.



We continued our longstanding partnership with the LA Phil to bring six blissfully eclectic KCRW Festival shows to the Hollywood Bowl. Performances ranged from Oscar-winning composer A.R. Rahman to icon of song and style, Grace Jones.









KCRW GROWTH

2022 has been a big year for KCRW's team. Over the past 12 months, we've welcomed 43 new team members including two new hosts — Janaya Williams on *All Things Considered* and David Greene on *Left, Right & Center.*

Our diversity, equity, and inclusion work has also remained at the core of what we do. Last summer, we released our second annual <u>Pledge for Equity Community Report</u>.

This year we assigned a reporter to the Healthy Communities beat, rounding out areas of importance to our community which also includes Housing & Homelessness and Small Business & Entrepreneurship. These dedicated reporters bring their expertise to programs across our schedule, including *All Things Considered, Morning Edition, Greater LA*, and more.
